COMMITTEE REPORTS

Audio Visual – No report. Discounts are valid until June 30, 2021 and may be viewed on the EPC Website.

Classroom Supplies – Ken Swink reviewed flyers on <u>Electrostatic Sprayers</u>, <u>AeraMax Air Cleaners</u> and <u>Entry Ice Melt</u> from Friends Office and flyers on <u>Customization and Convenience</u>, a <u>Covid Item List</u> and <u>ChildCraft Kid Spaces</u> from School Specialty. We are currently working on the final extension for this bid with our current vendors. We will review extension pricing and request approval at our January 2021 EPC General Membership Meeting. Cloud Communication Systems – Ken Swink shared a <u>flyer from Nebula Solutions</u> which reviews their exclusive EPC Member Discount program which is up to 50% off of list price. Some features include: Voice, video conferencing, chat, meetings, fax, call recording and free long distance anywhere in the USA. Custodial Supplies/Air Filters – Bryan Schenck of Waibel Energy Systems reminded the membership about their Air Filter program with the EPC. <u>Pricing is available on the EPC Website</u> and districts are encouraged to contact <u>Christy Fielding</u> of <u>Waibel Energy Systems</u> with questions or to setup an account with Waibel. Waibel Energy Systems is also an approved vendor for their ventilation systems technology that was recently awarded in our Disinfection as a Service category.

Disinfection as a Service – Ken Swink reported that 12 EPC member districts are currently using the Disinfection as a Service bid with Alpha & Omega with good results to date. Services are also available from Waibel Energy Systems and Medical Illumination. Contact Robin Houston to request pricing and additional information.

2021-7. Fine Paper – Ken Swink stated that copy paper pricing with Sterling Paper and Veritiv has been extended through March 31, 2021. Veritiv's Comet 92 remains the same at \$27.94 per case. Sterling Paper, whom has the lowest price, has raised their American Made 3150-2004 Copy Paper from \$25.95 to \$26.50. Sterling Paper is also still offering their Boise brand paper at \$26.99 per case. Both Sterling Paper and Veritiv offer an additional 1% discount if paid in net 30 days and further possible discounts on half or full truck loads upon contacting the vendor directly. Motion by Isaac Seevers, seconded by Joe Penney to accept the paper extension. Motion carried. A paper pricing comparison was distributed. Food Service — Stephanie Zinger confirmed that there are still numerous school food service issues that Covid-19 has created for schools. Many of these problems have been discussed on the EPC Google Group emails. These email conversations have become a great resource for our members as well as a helpful tool to resolve problems as they arise. Insurances – Doug Merkle reported that all EPC Benefit districts will have a January 1st renewal by 2022. Open enrollment for districts that currently renew in January will end on November 13th. The release of the renewal for the 2022 plan year should occur somewhere between mid-April and mid-May 2022. Lastly, our wellness program for the 2020-2021 school year is up and running.

2021-8. Transportation — Ken Swink announced that the EPC Bus Bid Opening for 124+ school buses was held on October 30th. For any districts that did not participate in this year's bus bid by filling out our survey and/or participating in our Legal Advertisement — you may still use the bid. When we publish our Legal Advertisement, we list each interested district along with the words "and ALL members of the Southwestern Ohio Educational Purchasing Council". Therefore, ALL EPC Member Districts are covered on the legal advertisement and bid. It is necessary for your district to pass a Board Resolution prior to making your purchase. 2021-9. Summary of 2019-2020 Rebates – Ken reviewed the <u>2019-20 Rebate Report</u> which includes rebates for the Food Service GFS Prime Vendor Agreement, Bakery, EPC Medical Insurance Wellness, Copy Paper and Classroom/Office Supply purchases. In past years we have also included rebates for Dairy purchases if invoices were paid in a timely fashion. Due to Reiter Dairy and Borden Dairy's recent bankruptcies we are unable to include the dairy rebates at this time. A <u>letter was included in the packet that further explains</u> that any district earning under \$25 will be paid in a future rebate check and any members that are receiving a check that includes previous years' (under \$25) amounts along with this year's rebate is indicated on the report in purple text. If you have any questions or concerns in regard to the Rebate Checks or If there is an area in which your district did not receive a rebate and would like to learn how to earn one for the current school year we'd be happy to help you, just let us know!
