COMMITTEE PROGRAM REPORTS

*Air Filters – Ken Swink announced to members that <u>Dayton Reliable Air Filter</u> pricing has been extended through June 30, 2026 with zero price changes. You may view the <u>vendor contact information</u>, information on how to order, and <u>Pricing</u> on the EPC Website.

*Copy Paper – Ken Swink announced that the EPC Copy Paper Program was extended with current vendors through December 31, 2025. The <u>lowest-priced white 8½ x 11 Copy Paper</u> is Millcraft's Natural Choice AJ8931 at \$32.50/case or Sterling Distribution's HiWhite at \$34.50/case. Both vendors will guarantee their paper and also offer a 1% discount if paid in net 30 days. We will continue to request pricing extensions every two months.

Design Build & Performance Contracting Services – Ken Swink explained that we have secured a 6-month extension for the EPC Design Build and Performance Contracting Services Program instead of our usual 1-year extension, so we can update our bid specifications and have time for our legal counsel to review them prior to doing a new bid. We hope to have our new program ready to approve at our January EPC General Membership Meeting.

Belinda Kenley of Energy Optimizers, USA, shared a flyer on How EOU can help with your next Facility Improvement Project. Jeff Evans of Evans Energy shared a flyer on safer and more efficient buildings to offset today's higher electric demand charges, and Jon Green of Prodigy Building Solutions shared their flyer, which reviews their areas of expertise. Liability Fleet & Property Insurance – Ken Swink stated that at this morning's EPC Liability Fleet & Property Meeting, we had Mr. Gary L. Sigrist Jr, the CEO and President of Safeguard Risk Solutions, speak to our members. His bio is included in today's meeting packet. His presentation on School Safety Focusing on Prevention was very impressive, and we wanted to share his valuable information with all EPC Members. Transportation – Ken Swink shared a <u>Bus Purchasing Survey</u> with members. Members who complete this <u>survey</u> are not committing to making any purchases, it is simply letting the potential bus vendors know which districts are interested. Utilities/Natural Gas – Ken Swink shared The <u>PJM Summer 2025 Peak Days</u> list with the membership. Ken also reviewed the <u>Farmers' Almanac VS the Old Farmer's Almanac Ohio Winter for 2025-26</u> and an article from the <u>Dayton Daily News on how Heating costs are projected to surge as natural gas prices, demand climb.</u>

Maha Kashani from IGS Energy <u>addressed ways to reduce electricity costs</u> through Demand Response, Peak Demand Shaving, Peak Load Contribution Shaving and Network Service Peak Load Shaving. An <u>Update on the EPC & Ohio School</u> <u>Consortium Natural Gas Program</u> was included in the meeting packet.

We also reported that the EPC Utilities Committee has approved an extension agreement with IGS, at the time of this meeting, two thirds of our members have already returned the signed amendment and or board resolutions. Prices have continued to increase since we secured our Energy/Losses hedge at \$0.05995 kWh.

We have also secured Natural Gas for July 2025 – June 2026 hedge pricing in four purchases which will average our total 80% hedge price at \$3.9310 Dth. We have not secured any hedges for July 2026 forward as the market price is currently at \$4.60 Dth. Our natural gas consultant, Mark Jergens, continues to update our hedging committee on market prices. The EPC also presented a handout showing historical hedges for the past four years. Finally, CenterPoint Energy, formerly Vectren, has been purchased by National Fuel headquartered in Western New York at a sale price of 2.62 billion dollars. The terms of the sale will be completed in the fourth quarter of 2026.

Workers' Compensation – Doug Merkle invited members to signup for the <u>Fall 2025 EPC/Hunter Consulting Safety</u> <u>Training Session</u> which will be held on November 6th via Zoom.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Financial Report – JeanAnn Cloud reviewed the <u>financial summary of the general operating fund</u>. The balance of the General Fund as of September 30, 2025, was \$1,166,149.24. Please contact <u>JeanAnn</u> with any questions or concerns.

2024-25 Rebates – Ken Swink reviewed the <u>2024-25 Rebate Report</u> which includes rebates for the Interest Dividend Member Participation, Food Service GFS Prime Vendor Agreement, EPC Medical Insurance Wellness Programs, Copy Paper and Classroom/Office Supply purchases. A total of **\$2,944,220.54** will be distributed to EPC Members. Any district earning under \$25 will be paid in a future rebate check and any members that are receiving a check that includes previous year's (under \$25) amounts along with this year's rebate are indicated on the report in orange. A history of all rebates given to EPC Members since the rebate program began in 2012 was also shared – a grand total of **\$17,043,566.66**! If you have any questions or concerns regarding the Rebate Checks or If there is an area in which your district did not receive a rebate and would like to learn how to earn one for the current school year, we'd be happy to help you, just let us know!



Interest Dividend Member Participation - Ken proudly reviewed the third year of the EPC Interest Dividend Member Participation Program with the EPC Members. For each EPC Member School participating in the EPC Health Insurance Program, effective September 1, 2025, we have increased our payout to \$55 per covered employee for each school district, \$6 per employee for EPC Dental Insurance participation, and \$3 per employee for EPC Vision Insurance participation. For those members participating in the health insurance program, we also paid \$27 per employee for those members who participate in the EPC Liability Fleet & Property Insurance program and \$4 per employee for those member districts that participate in our Hunter Consulting Workers Compensation Program. Lastly, we gave a bonus of \$20 per employee for any district that participates in all of the above-listed programs. Congratulations to the following EPC Member Districts who earned that additional bonus: Blanchester Local Schools, Bradford Exempted Village Schools, Cedar Cliff Local Schools, Darke County Educational Service Center, Greene County Educational Service Center, Greenville City Schools, Mad River Local Schools, Northridge Local Schools, Preble County Educational Service Center, Southern Ohio Educational Service Center, Tri Village Local Schools, Upper Valley Career Center, Warren County Educational Service Center and Wilmington City Schools. A total of **\$1,287,144** in EPC Dividends was paid out.
