If you have other family members on the policy, the overall family <u>deductible</u> must be met before the <u>plan</u> begins to pay. Deductible is non-embedded. Deductible resets January 1.		
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible?</u>	Yes. <u>Preventive care</u> is covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	 This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the annual <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply.
